“Please don’t close the window!” her pupils said. “We’ll cook in here if you do. Stop the children from making so much noise.”

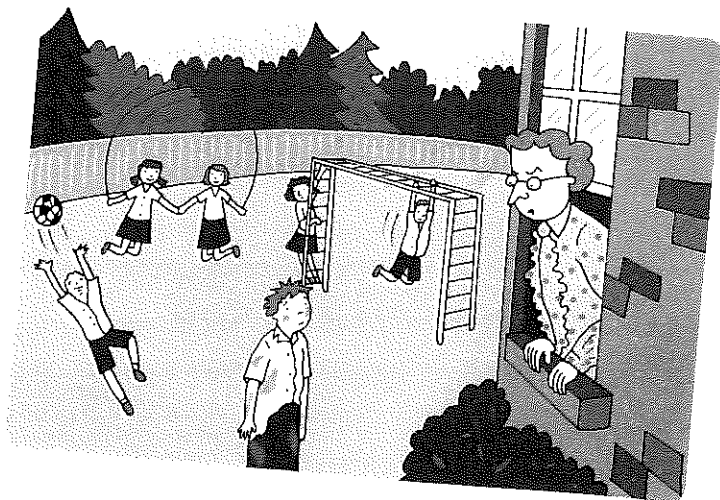

“I’m eight,” he said.

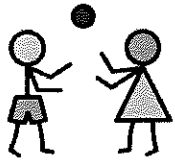
“Don’t tell lies,” the teacher said, “No one could get as dirty as you are in only eight years!”



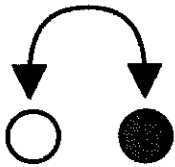

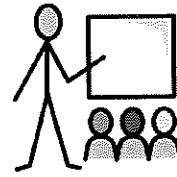

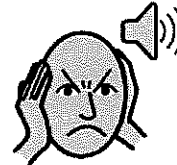
